Scouting started in Cyprus in 1913 as a Branch of The Scout Association, and in 1961 was granted direct membership of the World Scout Conference as The Boy Scouts of Cyprus.

The Association places great emphasis on helping refugee and disadvantaged children. This is revealed by the Organisation of a 26-day summer camp for 1,000 boys in 1975, which was combined with the Scouts offering home hospitality to the boys and visits by the Scouts to the refugee camps to provide recreational activities.

The Association also places emphasis on Community Development and is considering cooperation with other developing countries.

The Association is open to all boys and includes the Greek, Turkish, Maronite and Armenian Cypriots as well as the British Scouts on the British Sovereign Bases. Scout Troops have been started at a reform school, at a school for the blind and at a centre for training deaf and dumb children.
