

Planning your pathway to the Grey Wolf Award.

Good on you for taking up the challenge of achieving the Grey Wolf Award!


The Grey Wolf Award is best achieved through careful planning, discussions at Pack Council with your Cub Scout friends and Leaders and a clear understanding of what needs to be done and by when.

All activities must be completed, and the application form signed and submitted to the Victorian Scout Centre while you are still a Cub Scout and before your 11th birthday.

Helpful hints:

- You don't have to wait to complete your Gold Boomerang to start on your Grey Wolf. You can work on your Level 2 Achievement badges now.
- As soon as you have decided to begin this Challenge, let your Pack Council and Cub Leaders know. This will help in planning the outdoor activities, these must be done in the 12 months leading up to Pack Council approving your Grey Wolf application.
- > You can plan and complete the hike/day walk at any time during those 12 months. It is best not to leave it until the last moment.
- Do yourself a favour and plan to have everything done at least a month before your 11th birthday.

Here is a Grey Wolf timeline to help you plan your journey. Start by entering your Birthday and then work the dates backwards. Then use the Tracker to fill in what you do.
