### **What to expect**

You are commencing a practical and exciting leadership training program which we call the Wood Badge program. It's recognised by Scouts around the world. The training is delivered in some different ways: online 'On-Demand' modules, on the job learning, and courses.

You're embarking on what we call the 'Basic' level of the Wood Badge program, which consists of:

- Scouting Preliminary On-Demand modules
- Scouting Essentials On-Demand modules
- On The Job 'Plan>' Checklist
- Scouting Essentials course
- Scouting Adventure modules
- Scouting Adventure course (or completion of a 'Recognition of Proficiency' if you've got existing outdoors skills)

### **Who can help**

To help you with your training and to help talk you through your training plan, you have a local training mentor, often an experienced Leader from within your Scout Group or someone nearby.

If you do not know who this is ask your Group Leader.

Do get in touch with your mentor! They are a great resource to help you start your training, but they can also help with getting to know other people around the District, or can provide some pointers if you're getting stuck.

A really important gateway for a lot of the training is the Scouts Australia On-Demand Portal, which also includes the On The Job training checklists.

## **How to apply for training courses**

## **What we sign up to as Leaders**

You have committed through your Mutual Agreement to complete Basic training within 12 months. This level of training provides the necessary skills to carry out your role, which we recognise with a Certificate of Proficiency. We make these commitments to training as Leaders because young people, parents and the community expect Scout Leaders to be proficient.

If you have a reason that you're unable to complete this training within 12 months, you will need to seek a short extension through your District Team. However, if you have not completed this training after 15 months you will automatically become an Adult Helper in your section and no longer able to wear your Scout uniform.

If you have any challenges in your role or if you need more assistance, your first point of contact should be your Group Leader.

Once again welcome to Scouting as a Leader and congratulations on your new appointment.
