

Cuboree at Healesville Sanctuary - Event Information

We look forward to welcoming you at Healesville Sanctuary on the 26, 27 and 28 September 2023. Please find information below about what you need to bring and what you will be doing on the day.

Drop off and pick up

- On arrival, buses will be directed to our overflow car park. Buses can remain in this area for the duration of the
 visit.
- Cubs will disembark and be guided to our Nature Trail. This area is nearby to our Tasmanian Devil breeding habitats please be quiet as you walk from the bus parking area into the Nature Trail. Our team will tell you when you need to be quiet and when it's okay to make noise again.
- On departure, Cubs will be guided back to the buses along the same route.

Things to know:

- You will be on Wurundjeri Woi Wurung Biik/Country at what is now known as Healesville Sanctuary. This place is home to wildlife, animals in our care and animals who are part of our Threatened Species Breeding Programs. This area is a significant bushland cared for by dedicated teams. Please be respectful of the animals that call this place home and follow our team's instructions.
- It is Poorneet (tadpole) season on Wurundjeri Country in September the season when the temperature is rising but rain continues, when currawongs call, flax-lilies flower and myrnong (yam daisy) roots are ready to eat. Please bring sun protection. In the event of rain, some shelter will be provided, but please bring/wear weather appropriate clothing.
- Our Zoos Victoria Detection Dog Team will be presenting to you about the work they do with threatened species.
 Please note that as these are working dogs and there will be no opportunities to pat or interact with the dogs.

- You will be walking on bush and gravel tracks including some uneven ground please mind your step and wear appropriate footwear.
- Please take your rubbish with you.

Things to bring:

- A backpack, sun protection, and a water bottle.
- Comfortable walking shoes and weather appropriate clothing.
- Anything else you need including any medications, e.g. inhaler.
