Want to apply to the Sporting Club Grant program but don't have a project in mind? Check out the examples below of sporting equipment and uniforms your Group could use as a project. This document covers ideas for Category 1 and 2 applications.

Category 1 – On-field Uniforms and Equipment

Think about our OAS area and consider what gear could support your Unit's activities. N.B. Most suggested gear could be used across multiple OAS areas but is only listed once, consider the full list before deciding. This list is not exhaustive.

Bushcraft – Including Pioneering and Survival Skills

- Compasses
- Whistles
- Emergency shelters and blankets
- Sunscreen and sun protection
- Spars
- Rope
- Mallets
- Flint and steel
- Water purification tools
- Tarpaulins

Bushwalking

- Hiking tents
- Hike stoves
- Maps

Camping

- Standing camp tents
- Torches
- Sleeping mats/stretchers and sleeping bags
- Tent pegs
- Eating/cooking shelters

Alpine – Including Cross Country Skiing, Snow Camping and Hiking, Downhill Skiing, Snowboarding

- Outerwear – Snow jackets and pants
- Accessories – Gloves, beanies, thermals
- Crampons
- Ski poles, trekking poles

Aquatics – Including Life Saving, Swift Water Rescue, Snorkelling, Scuba, Surfing

- Snorkels
- Fins
- Diving masks
- Surfboards
- Rescue tubes and ropes

Boating – Including Sailing and Windsurfing

- Dry bags

Cycling – Including Cycle Touring and Mountain Biking

- Bikes
- Bike helmets

Paddling – Including Canoeing, White Water Rafting, Kayaking, White Water Kayaking and Sea Kayaking

- Personal flotation devices
- Paddles

Vertical – Including Abseiling, Canyoning, Caving, Climbing

- Harnesses
- Helmets
- Ropes and carabiners
- Crates (crate stacking)

Other

- Archery – bows and arrows
- Uniform shirts
