


VISITS TO OUR MUSEUM AND ADVENTURE CENTRE

As we reflect on the period under review, it is pleasing to note an increase in the number of visits conducted compared with last year.

Forty-four visits including one open day were conducted, giving us the opportunity to welcome and share our rich Scouting history with 675 visitors. This figure is represented by 235 adults and 440 youth (63 Joeys, 247 Cubs, 93 Scouts, 33 Venturers and 4 Rovers).

Many of our visitors offer positive feedback which is always welcome, as it enables us to gauge what they have learnt and enjoyed from their visit. Sometimes, ideas for future displays are received and these are also welcome.

We cannot underestimate the important role played by our tour guide team. Visits cannot be

conducted unless we have a sound base of volunteers. Each Visit requires a minimum of three guides - sometimes more depending on the numbers expected. This year the team has contributed 402 volunteer hours to the conduct of visits. This figure does not include the time involved in processing and recording the bookings, nor the time devoted to providing special displays at local groups. Our sincere thanks go to all the team who have made themselves available, particularly those who have "done the extra mile", often at short notice.

This year we were pleased to welcome Stephen Bond to the team.

COLLECTIONS

SHV is blessed (and cursed) with the number of donations which arrive at the Centre. Whilst some are duplicate items already held in the Collection, we often find items we have not seen before or are a real 'treasure'.

We are developing strategies to recycle textiles and badges going into youth visit packs and for sale in the shop.

The Team continues to work on items based on Categories to sort, catalogue and store to grow our verified collection.

IT SUPPORT

Routine tasks like providing support to the Adventure Centre Team and the Collections Team plus updating of computer operating systems and managing backups continues to occupy a lot of time on Monday workdays.

The ability to provide support remotely using the VPN has been improved with the limited use of WOL and RDP technologies to assist. It is possible to maintain a lot of the systems from a remote location at times when the Mackie Road site is not in operation, and to also assist remotely with some things on a Monday when the centre is operating but IT Support is not on site.

Access to the VPN and RDP has been extended to the two team members maintaining the Badges and Scarves database so that they can simultaneously update the Access database remotely using the Remote Desktop protocol to connect to computers at Mackie Road. This has resolved the problems that we were having with data conflicts although some latency still exists in the system due to the bandwidth available.

An additional tiny-desktop computer has been purchased and added to the Domain to allow more data entry operators to work simultaneously. Additional ESET Protect licences have been purchased to protect this new workstation plus two laptops being used off site by members of the team. An additional 27" Touch-screen computer has been

purchased for use in the Adventure Centre and for off-site displays and a replacement laptop has been purchased to make the editing of video files off-site more efficient.

The ability to view and retrieve documents from within the DB/TextWorks textbases has been extended to the Media Catalogue textbase. This has allowed the downloading and launching of video files as part of searches of this textbase, both at Mackie Road and remotely via the VPN.

A training session was run for the team on how to deal with cyber-attacks on their home computers.

The end-of-support for Windows 10 in October 2025 means that a minimum of 4 desktop computers and one laptop will ideally need replacing before then. After that time, they will no longer receive security updates and therefore will progressively become more vulnerable to attack.

The IT Support work has been limited in the past 12 months due to family health issues limiting Bob Doyle's availability. The recent recruitment of Peter Richardson into an additional IT Support position means that the workload can be shared and his system administration experience will assist in the growth of the IT systems at Scout Heritage Victoria into the future.

NEWSPAPER CLIPPINGS


Work on our newspaper clippings database has slowed down a little this year. That said, all of the office drawers for Group Clippings and Individual Clippings are catalogued, scanned and in the database. The office drawers for Miscellaneous Clippings are all catalogued, but scanning has only reached the Letter 'C' drawer.

Our clipping service has continued to provide eight to ten new articles per week and, given that these are already in pdf or web format, they don't require scanning, but are catalogued once a fortnight or so. There may be minor delays in moving them from the Scanned Folder into the database as Bob Doyle takes them from the Scanned Folder, converts them to searchable pdfs

and then loads them into the database.

Although we do get new printed newspaper articles coming into the collection, these are being held over until the Miscellaneous Drawers are completed. In addition, the scrapbooks containing newspaper articles have been catalogued, but will not be scanned in the foreseeable future. These are kept in the Compactus in Room 8.

Data entry and scanning are not complicated, merely requiring basic familiarity with Microsoft Excel and the ability to scan articles into pdf format. We already have two computers at SHV set up to do this. If you're looking for a project, this is a good one to start on.

JAMBOREE!

The average Scout Life of a boy is a comparatively short one and it is good for each generation of Scouts to see at least one big rally since it enables the boy to realise his membership of a really great brotherhood and at the same time brings him into personal acquaintance with brother Scouts of other districts and other countries.

— *Baden-Powell*, (September 1932)

Victoria was honoured to stage the first Australian Jamboree at Frankston in 1934/35. With the attendance of Lord Baden-Powell, the Chief Scout of the World it made for an exciting and memorable event.

Jamborees followed on a cycle of 3 years (except during World War II) with Victoria staging the 1948/49 Jamboree at Yarra Brae, followed by the 1955/56 Jamboree at Yarra Brae (now Clifford

Park). The Police Paddocks at Dandenong saw the 1964/65 Jamboree and in the same location the 1976/77 Jamboree.

Jamborees returned to Victoria in 1992 at Ballarat, followed by 2007 Jamboree at Elmore. Although COVID-19 prevented the 2022 Australian Jamboree at Elmore from running Victoria staged VicJam at Elmore as a state only event.

The Jamboree cycle has now changed to 4 years and next to be held at Maryborough in Queensland in January 2025.

At this year's ARAP Scout Heritage Victoria is delving into its vast collection of memorabilia items from the 1948/49 and 1955/56 Jamborees to highlight these Jamborees as an example of commitment and extensive organisation by the Victorian Team of the era.
