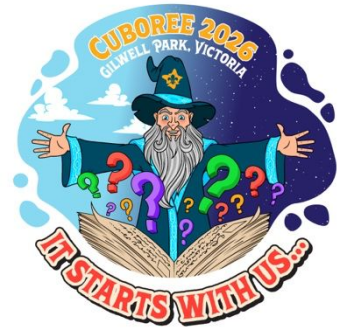


GOING TO CUBOREE 2026



What is Cuboree? Cuboree is a big, exciting camping adventure for Cub Scouts!

I will go to Gilwell Park in Gembrook for five days. I will do fun activities, play games, sleep in a tent and make new friends. I will be with Cubs from my group and Cubs from other Scout groups.

My Home At Cuboree: The Campsite



My Cuboree Unit's campsite is surrounded by trees and nature! Adults will set up the campsite and my tent before I arrive.

My Camping Unit will have a number, like 113. I can use the Cuboree map to find my campsite and activity places.

My campsite will be like a small village. There will be a kitchen, an eating shelter, tents for Cubs, and tents for Leaders. I will sleep in a tent with other Cubs and keep my gear nearby.

My leaders will sleep in separate tents nearby.

There will be adults at my campsite who can help me.

Unit Leader – My Unit Leader helps run the campsite. They help Cubs and Leaders get ready for meals, activities, and night-time fun.

Line Leader – My Line Leader looks after me and a small group of Cubs. I can ask my Line Leader for help if I have a question or problem.

Cooks – The cooks make meals for my Unit. They will be camping nearby.



My Unit might have a special hat. If we do, I can wear it so my friends and Leaders can find me more easily.

My Cuboree Week: Day by Day

Monday: I Arrive And Settle In

Getting to the bus: I can leave my normal Cub uniform at home. I will wear my Cuboree shirt and scarf. I will meet the other Cubs and Leaders from my Group at the bus stop. Adults will put my bags under the bus. Then I will get on the bus.



Travelling by bus: The bus trip might take a while. I can play quiet games, talk to other Cubs, or do colouring. I can feel excited about going to Cuboree.

Getting settled: The bus will arrive near my campsite. Adults will unpack the gear. I will carry my bags a short way to my campsite. My Leaders will tell me the camp rules and give me a wristband. I will wear the wristband for all of Cuboree.



Then I can find my tent, unpack my bag, and look around my campsite.

Tuesday to Thursday: Action-Packed Days & Evenings

Activity bases: On Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, I will visit two big activity bases each day. One will be in the morning. One will be in the afternoon. I will walk with my Unit, my small group, and my Line Leader.

Each base has a different name and theme. My Line Leader can help me find the way and join in the activities.

Some activities I might try are:

The Mud Obstacle Course:

I can crawl, slip, and slide through mud. I might get a little muddy or very muddy. After the mud, I can go through the Cub Wash. Later, I can have a shower and put on clean clothes.

The Dry Challenge Course:

If I do not want to get muddy, I can try a dry obstacle course instead.

Other fun bases: I might try archery, building, games, craft, team challenges, climbing walls, and science experiments.





Lunch at camp: At lunchtime, I will go back to my campsite. I will eat lunch with my Unit. Then I will go to another activity base.

Dinner and dishes: Each evening, I will eat dinner with my Unit under the marquee. The cooks will make hot meals. After dinner, I will wash my own dishes.





Night-time fun: After dinner, the whole camp will come together for fun.

Comedy Night: I can watch jokes and funny skits.

Cubs Got Talent Night: I can cheer for Cubs who share their talents.

Disco Night: I can dance, listen to music, and have fun.

There will be lots of Cubs at the concerts. I might sit close to other Cubs so everyone can fit. If I need help, I can ask my Leaders.



Friday: I Pack Up and Go Home

Packing my gear: After breakfast, I will pack my bag. I will tidy my tent and say goodbye to my campsite. I will carry my bags a short way to the bus. Adults will put the bags on the bus.



Going home by bus: I will get back on the bus with Cubs and Leaders from my Group. When I get home, I can tell my family about my Cuboree adventure.



Things That Might Feel Different and What I Can Do

Sleeping in a tent: Sleeping in a tent might feel different from sleeping at home. It might be darker or noisier.

What I can do: I can keep my torch close. I can bring a small favourite toy and my pillow.

Lots of people: Cuboree is big. There may be lots of people and loud sounds.

What I can do: I can tell my Leader if I need quiet time. There will be quiet places where I can rest.

Trying new foods: The meals are cooked for lots of Cubs. Some food might be new to me.

What I can do: I can try a small bite. If I do not like it, I can tell my Leader so they can make sure I stay full.

Using toilets and showers: The toilets and showers will not be right next to my tent. I will need to walk a short way.

What I can do: I can walk with a buddy or Leader. I can use a shower bag for my soap, towel, and clean clothes.

Feeling homesick: I might miss home. Lots of Cubs feel this way sometimes.

What I can do: I can talk to a Leader or a friend. I can join in activities. I can remember that my family is proud of me.
